Notes: Over 55 doctors, 20 nurses, 12 pharmacists, and 250 non-professionals volunteer to work at the clinic. Clergy provide pastoral care. Annually, on St. Luke's Day, clinic holds a silent auction, 5k run and fun walk to raise funds.
